#### About the Five Seasons Ski Team

The club was formed in 1978 for the purpose of advancing the sport of waterskiing. This includes individual skiing, show skiing, recreational skiing, and general safety principles. Recreational and beginning skiers have the opportunity to learn all facets of waterskiing from the basics to tournament events and barefoot skiing. The club provides boats, skis and other equipment to our regularly scheduled practices and ski schools. Members and skiers range in ages from five to seventy years old and there are no age limitations. Current club membership is approximately 50-60 people.

The Five Seasons Ski Team performs a show most Thursday nights at Ellis Park in Cedar Rapids, IA Memorial Day thru Labor Day. Special shows are performed for various communities and festivals. The team also competes in regional and national show ski tournaments. We strive to provide quality family entertainment for the Cedar Rapids area. #### What is Show Ski?

Show skiing is a type of water skiing where skiers perform tricks somewhat similar to those of gymnasts while being pulled by the boat. Traditional ski show acts include pyramids, ski doubles, freestyle jumping, and swivel skiing. Show skiing is normally performed at water ski shows, with elaborate costumes, choreography, music, and featuring an announcer.

#### Interesting Facts About Show Ski Teams

- Rope: Over 2 miles of rope are used in a show
- A safety boat and multiple tow-boats are used during a show
- Average Pyramid Weight:

(Depends on girl body-size)

- · 3rd Tier center position 140-200 lbs.
- 4th Tier center positions 200-250 lbs. shoulder in positions 95-110 lbs.
- 5 Tier center position 350-400 lbs. guys next to center 290-320 lbs. end positions 115-125 lbs.

Did you know...

- Five Seasons was the first lowa team to Successfully perform a 4-tier pyramid in a tournament.
- Little Crow Ski Team (New London, MN) was the first in REGION to do a 5-tier pyramid. Five Seasons was the first lowa team to successfully perform a 5-tier pyramid in a tournament.

#### What is a Show Tournament?

The Five Seasons Ski Team competes regionally against other show teams. Teams who place well at regionals advance to the National tournament, competing against other teams from across the country.

In a show tournament, each team gets one hour to perform their show at the hosting team's site. There are 5-7 judges scoring several key factors - flow, difficulty, execution, spectator appeal, boat driving, costumes, music, sound, announcing, and overall show. Scores are configured and awards are announced to the top teams.



## SAFETY HAND SIGNALS



#### Water Ski Act Descriptions

In the next section of the program, each act the team performs will feature a photo and a desciption of the act. Traditional ski show acts include pyramids, strap doubles, freestyle jumping, and swivel skiing. However, there are other acts requiring more precision and and skill, i.e., helicopters/flips, 50 mph barefoot pyramids.

Many of our active members are not skiers at all. Equipment personel, dock director, sound crew, announcer, boat crews, and numerous other positions provide challenging and rewarding opportunities for those who enjoy being involved, without getting wet. It is amazing how fast members learn and enjoy their skills.

#### Strap Doubles

Strap Doubles is very similar to pairs ice skating except that it is performed on the water. The base is connected to the boat with a strap harness around his or her waist. This leaves the hands free to perform many different lifts with the person on top. This act requires a great amount of mutual trust between the doubles partners and also with the safety person in the boat. The safety person is responsible for releasing the skiers from the boat in case of a fall.



#### Jump

Jump is when skiers ski over a floating ramp. The first performance of water ski jumping was by Dick Pope in Miami Beach, Florida in 1928. Our jumpers wear helmets and padded suits to help protect them in case of a fall. Jumping may include variations such as multiple skiers going over the ramp while other skiers will cross under them. The skiers going over the ramp may be performing helicopter spins and flips! Watch the other skiers as they crisscross underneath or split between the skiers going over the jump!




#### **Pyramids**

The pyramid is one of the most popular acts with ski show spectators and probably the most photographed. Pyramids are one of the most difficult acts to put on the water. They require a lot of towing power, strong base skiers, and teamwork. The bases of the pyramid must carry the weight of all the climbers above them. The climbers must climb with quick precise movements to their proper positions. Many nights are spent practicing the climbing on land before it is attempted on the water. Climbing the pyramid is only half the battle! Once it is up and passes the crowd the climbers must come down in the reverse order that they climbed. This can sometimes be more difficult than actually building the pyramid. In 2011, the five seasons ski team became one of the few teams in the world capable of building a 5-tier pyramid!

#### **Barefoot Pyramid**

The barefoot pyramid looks just like it sounds, bases barefooting with a person standing on their shoulders between them. They start out on skis, the top person climbs into position and then the bases proceed to step out of their skis one at a time.







#### Barefoot Bomb-Out

In this form of starting, the skier jumps out of the skis and begins barefooting.



#### Barefoot Beach-Start

Just as the name implies, barefoot beach-start is sliding off the beach, then barefooting away!



#### Barefoot

Barefooting is probably one of the most fast paced and exciting acts in show skiing. Just as the name implies this act involves skiers skimming across the water at high speed on their bare feet. Barefoot line is multiple skiers barefooting in a line. They usually start barefooting by stepping out of a single ski.

#### Backwards Barefoot

Just like front barefoot, except that the skiers barefoot backwards.




#### **Barefoot Flyers**

The barefooter jumps off the dock or a platform.



#### Ballet Line

Ballet line is a high energy dance on skis! The skiers perform a choreographed dance to music while skiing. While performing their dance on the water you may see them holding the handle in various different ways. Holding the handle with their legs or using a heel or toe hold leaves the skiers hands free for arm movements. It takes several hours of practice to just learn the choreography for this act. They have also spent additional hours learning how to do a hop-dock alone as well as in large groups. Hop dock pulling boat drivers are very critical to this act. Just a little too fast or too slow off the dock and the skiers might get pulled out the front or sink.



#### Backwards Around the Boat

Just like frontwards around the boat, only backwards. If the skier is performing the act backwards the boat driver must be alert to where the skier is at all times.



#### Around-The-Boat

Multiple skiers ski completely around the boat. The skiers wear helmets and floatation in case of an accident. They start lined up so the skier with the longest rope is to the right. As the skiers progress around the boat the skiers with the shorter ropes pass under the longer ropes. When the skiers finish the act the skier with the shortest rope is to the right. The skiers on the longer ropes must always be alert in case another skier should fall so they can avoid hitting them. The boat driver must also be very alert for the skiers safety.



#### Trios

Each set of Trios consists of two skiers on the bottom and one on the top. The bases are connected to the boat with a strap harness around their waist leaving their hands free for lifting the top person in various positions.



#### Conventional Doubles

In this two-person performance, the base holds on to a handle and skis while another person contorts into various formations.



#### Shoe Skiing

Skis not much bigger than the feet in them mark this unique form of skiing. Requiring higher speeds due to their small size, shoe skis are sometimes used as a starting point for barefooters in training.



#### Swivel

Swivel Skiing is one of the most graceful acts in show skiing. It is also probably one of the hardest acts to learn. This act gets its name from the binding that is used on the ski. The binding is mounted on a ball-bearing which allows the binding to rotate 360 degrees. Swivel skiers perform their unique water ballet either with a handheld tow rope or a special toe-hold handle with a safety release in the boat. Willa McGuire Cook originated swivel skiing in the 1950's when she combined the graceful moves of ballet with water skiing by using a swivel binding on a ski. This highly successful concept is now seen in ski shows all over the world.




#### Wakeboarding

In the last decade, wakeboarding has become one of water-skiing's fastest growing disciplines. With the ability to perform jaw-dropping aerial stunts, these skiers never cease to amaze!



### **Boat Drivers**

Our boat drivers spend several hours each year practicing their timing and control. Without precise control of the speed and path of the boat, our skiers could not perform many of the exciting acts you will see while enjoying our show. The rope handler riding in the boat insures the skier's safety during a fall and are an integral part of the boat driving team. Our 2024 driving team includes Don Clow, Brian Schultz, and Steve Straub.
